Federal Funds for Meals on Wheels

Volunteers and clients have been inquiring over the past month about the impact of the proposed federal budget on our organization. Federal funding for meals on wheels programs include Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) as well as money from the Older Americans

Act (OAA).

The proposed budget cuts would eliminate CDBGs, which is money the federal government gives to states to disperse at their discretion. OAA funding comes from the Department of Health

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The mission of TLC Meals on Wheels is to enrich the lives of seniors and others by providing nutritious meals and services that promote dignity, well-being and independence.

Federal Funds for Meals on Wheels

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and Human Services, which could face a budget cut of up to 18%. Although TLC does not request or receive OAA Funds, 35% of the funding for meals on wheels programs nationally comes from the OAA.

TLC MoW has diverse funding sources that include meal payments, individual donations, foundation grants, community and religious organization donations, fundraising events and local government. We do not request or receive OAA funds, but \$34,000 or about 6% of our annual

Thanks to the Rose Community Foundation, the Paige Foundation and additional funds from the City of Centennial's block grant for funding our new kitchen equipment. Replacing our 1960's oven with a new one, plus a double convection oven, a new steamer and extra freezer space allowed us to increase our capacity. We now serve over 400 meals a day plus an additional 250 meals for the weekend. We appreciate all of your support in helping us meet the needs of our seniors, now and for the future! ☺

budget is from the City of Centennial's block grant money. Those funds support 566 meals each month!

The 400 seniors we serve every day rely on us for a nutritious meal, a visit from a volunteer who may be the only person they see that day, and a sense of security that someone is checking in on them. In a recent survey, 82% of our clients indicated receiving meals improved their overall quality of life and 84% agree participating in the program allows them to remain independent in their own home, which is much more cost effective than other alternatives. After all, we can provide a senior with meals for an entire year for \$1200, roughly the same cost of an average one-day stay in the hospital or ten days or less in a nursing home. Cutting meals on wheels programs will ultimately result in long-term increases in mandatory government spending such as Medicaid.



TLC Meals on Wheels is turning 50 in 2018!

It was in 1968 when our founder, Virginia Baker first prepared meals in her home and delivered them to seniors in Littleton. From those humble beginnings in her kitchen, we have grown into an organization that delivers over 2,100 meals a week throughout the South Metro Denver area.

More than Just a Meal

For more than 45 years, Marilyn Ness, our longest serving volunteer, has been bringing love, companionship, and joy to our clients



and staff alike. Although she'll turn 88 this year, Marilyn has no plans to retire. "I'll just keep helping until I'm no longer able," she says with her twinkling eyes and friendly smile.

Marilyn grew up in Pinedale, Wyoming, and while attending the University of Wyoming, met and then married her husband Norman. His career as an Amoco drilling engineer ultimately required their growing family to move 16 times in 19 years. "With some moves, I barely had time to unpack,

find the school, doctor, and grocery store before it was time to pack up and move again," she says. But in 1969 they were finally able to settle down in Littleton, buying the home where Marilyn still lives. With their two sons in middle and high school and Norman at work, Marilyn soon jumped at the chance to begin delivering for TLC Meals on Wheels, after an assistant to founder Virginia Baker came to their church to recruit volunteers. Marilyn recounts that her first route had only five deliveries and that the meals, covered in foil and wrapped in newspaper, could leak all over the front seat if they happened to tip over along the route.

Fifteen years ago, due to foot problems that made climbing stairs difficult, she switched from delivering meals to helping make them in our kitchen, where she still volunteers every Friday morning.

Marilyn's 45+ years of memories have made her an invaluable resource in helping us piece together and preserve our history. To her, the best part has been making a difference in the lives of those she has served. "Where else can you so easily enrich the lives of hundreds of people?" she asks. "I'm so blessed to be able to still give to others."

We have all been enriched by Marilyn's many years of unwavering and selfless service! ☺
